School History

Mr Samuel Mensah conceived, planned and founded MicJaden International School when he relocated to Kwafokrom and saw the opportunity to deliver quality and affordable education for his children, community and the surrounding towns.

Rev. Peter Kofi Nyarko cut the sod for the construction of school on 15th December 2019 in the presence of Mrs. Grace Nyarko, Mrs. Nyarkoh Afua Konadu Mensah, Adom Nana Abena Mensah Nyarko-Abronomia, Nhyira Afua Mensah Asiedu, Afriyie Akosua Mensah Owusua, Samuel Kofi Abayie Mensah, Mr. Daniel Kelvin Mensah and Mrs. Elaine Mensah.

The first phase of the school was from Creche to Basic 3 which was completed in June 2020 as a Day School, but the opening day delayed due to the Covid 19 pandemic which caused the closure of all educational institutions in the country until 21st January 2021. The school started with 70 children by the end of the first term.

Currently, the school has a total population of 250 with 27 teaching and non-teaching staff with classes from Creche to Junior High School Form 2.

Mr. Daniel Kelvin Mensah, Managing Partner of Whitehall Advisors became one of the founding directors and proposed the name, Micah Jaden International School. Micah Jaden is the name of his first-born boy child. The Founder coined it to MicJaden International School. Micah (Who is Like God) and Jaden (God Has Heard)

On 16th June 2023, Mr. Kwasi Obeng Boadi by registration officially replaced Mr. Daniel Kelvin Mensah as director and acquired 30% shareholding in the school whilst Mr. Samuel Mensah (Founder) retained 70% majority shareholdings. Currently, the Board Chairman is Mr Kwasi Obeng Boadi and Mr Samuel Mensah, the Chief Servant (Chief Executive Officer)

The school started with Mrs. Nyarko Afua Konadu Mensah as the Principal and Ms. Cynthia Afatsaw as the Administrator with Mrs. Patience Agyemeng and Mrs. Akpene Ayeta part of the pioneer teachers.

The school over the past 5 years is offering the Ghana Education Service Curriculum. MicJaden International School undertook several extra curriculum activities with excursions to the Osu Castle, Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Park, Kotoka Internal Airport, National Theatre, the Achimota Mall and many educational tours in the municipality.

The Board and Management have been conscious in making the school facilities user friendly for physically challenged pupils. In view of this, the Debby Bless " Foundation adjudged Micjaden International School the Most Inclusive School in the Nsawam Adoagyiri Municipality.

The school has over the years made several donations to the needy and poor in the society. The PTA also offer scholarship to deserving pupils to facilitate their education.

By special resolution on 24th May 2025, the PTA resolved to switch the curriculum to the Oxford International Curriculum

To our parents and guardians, thank you for entrusting MicJaden Int. School with your children's education. Your partnership and support mean the world to us.

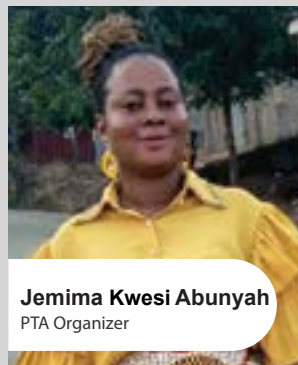
